The Board met pursuant to a recess taken September, 22nd, and transacted the following business to-wit:

ORDINANCE FOR OPEN SEASON FOR GAME.

The following Ordinance on motion duly seconded and carried by the unanimous vote of the Board present, was ordered, read on the minutes, adopted and published in the Reno Svening Gazette, once a week for five weeks, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION OF VALLEY QUAIL WITHIN THE COUNTY OF WASHOE, STATE OF NEVADA, AND PROVIDING PROPERTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Washoe, State of Nevada, acting under the authority of that certain Act of the Legislature entitled "An Act to provide for the protection and preservation of fish and game, providing penalties for a violation thereof, and repealing all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith. Approved March 27th, 1917, after first having applied for and received the written authority of the State Fish and Game Warden of the State of Nevada, de ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm, company, corporation or association to kill, catch, destroy, trap, net, cage, pound, weir, or pursue, with intent to catch, capture, injure or destroy any valley quail, within the County of Washoe, State of Hevada, at any time from and including December 1st, and before Movember 30th of each and every year.

SECTION 2. The open season for valley quail within the County of Washoe, State of Nevada, shall be upon the 30th day of Hovember of each and every year.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to kill, or have in his possession, within the County of Washoe, State of Nevada, a greater number than fifteen (15) valley quail in any one day.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm, company, corporation or association violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed quilty of a misdemeanor, and upon a conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty (\$50.00) dollars, nor more than two hundred and fifty (\$250.00) dollars, or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a term of not less than twenty five (25) days, nor more than one hundred and twenty-five (125) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
