The board met pursuant to a recess taken August 5, 1922 and transacted the following business, to-wit:

<u>SPECIAL ORDINANCE</u>

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CLOSED SEASON ON GROUSE AND MOUNTAIN QUAIL; REGULATING THE NUMBER OF GROUSE AND VALLEY QUAIL THAT MAY BE KILLED IN ONE DAY, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

THE BAORD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHOE COUNTY, NEVADA, do ordain:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm, company, corporation, or association, within the County of Washoe, State of Nevada, to kill, catch, trap, net, pound, weir, wound, or pursue with attempt to catch, capture, injure, or destroy any grouse, between the first day of September, 1922 and the first day of April, 1923, save and excepting that period of time from October 1, 1922 to October 15, 1922.

Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm, company, corporation, or association, within the County of Washoe, State of Nevada, to kill, catch, trap, net, pound, weir, wound, or pursue, with attempt to catch, capture, injure, or destroy any mountain quail, between the first day of September, 1922 and the first day of April, 1923.

Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any persons or persons, firm, company, corporation, or association, within the County of Washoe, State of Nevada, to kill, catch, or trap any number of grouse, exceeding five grouse, in one day during the open season, or any number of valley quail, exceeding ten valley quail, in any one day during the open season.

Sec. 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than fifty (50.00) dollars, or more than two hundred fifty (250.00) dollars, or by imprisonment in the County jail of Washoe County, Nevada, forma term of not less than twenty-five days, or more than one hundred twemty-five days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, adoption, and publication, twice, in a newspaper of general circulation in Washoe County, Nevada.

Sec. 6. The County Clerk and Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County, Nevads, is hereby authorized and directed to have this ordinance published twice in the Reno Evening Gazette, a daily newspaper of general circulation of Washoe County, Nevads.
