GAME REFUGESSES.

On motion duly seconded and carried by the unanimous vote of the board, it was ordered that all of that territory north in Washoe County lieing north of the southern line of Township 34 N., be set aside as a refuge for Antelope.

It was further ordered that all of that territory in Washoe County from the Glendale Bridge east to the Derby Dam, one mile north of the Truckee River be set aside as a refuge for wild birds.

It was further ordered that clerk notify the Governor, in reply to his letter of the 11th of May, that Washoe County game wardens will give every assistance in the work and that the commissioners are willing to deputize Forest Reserve Rangers and other suitable persons to assist in the work.

Whereupon a recess was taken until Thursday, June 21, 1923 at 10:00 o'clock A.M.
