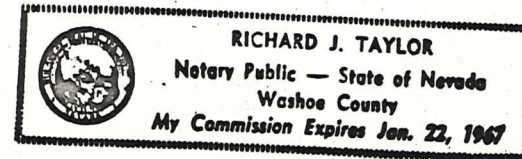

**NOTICE OF COUNTY ORDINANCE**  
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that  
Bill No. 123, Ordinance No. 134, AN OR-  
DINANCE TO MAKE IT UNLAWFUL  
FOR MINORS UNDER THE AGE OF  
EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS TO LOITER  
OR BE IN PUBLIC PLACES IN THE  
UNINCORPORATED AREA OF WASH-  
OE COUNTY BETWEEN CERTAIN  
HOURS, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR  
PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF SUCH  
MINORS TO PERMIT A VIOLATION  
OF SAID CURFEW, PROVIDING CER-  
TAIN EXCEPTIONS THERETO, PRO-  
VIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION  
THEREOF, AND OTHER MATTERS  
PROPERLY RELATING THERETO,  
was proposed on August 5, 1965, by  
Commissioner Cunningham and final ac-  
tion of adoption was taken on August  
16, 1965.  
The vote on the above Ordinance was

SUMMARY: Makes it unlawful for minors under eighteen (18) years of age to loiter in public places during certain hours, and further makes it unlawful for parents or guardians of such minors to permit a violation of this Ordinance, provides exceptions thereto and penalties thereto and other matters properly relating thereto.

ORDINANCE NO. 134

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE IT UNLAWFUL FOR MINORS UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS TO LOITER OR BE IN PUBLIC PLACES IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF WASHOE COUNTY BETWEEN CERTAIN HOURS, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF SUCH MINORS TO PERMIT A VIOLATION OF SAID CURFEW, PROVIDING CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS THERETO, PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHOE COUNTY DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Unlawful for Minors to Loiter; Curfew.

A. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years to loiter, idle, wander, stroll, or be in or upon the public streets, alleys, highways, roads or other public places in the unincorporated area of the County of Washoe at any time between the hours of 10:00 P.M. and 5:00 A.M. of the following day, Sunday through Thursday, and between the hours of 12:00 Midnight and 5:00 A.M. of the following day, Friday and Saturday.

B. This Section shall not apply to any person:

- (1) Who is accompanied by his or her parent, guardian or other adult person having legal care, custody and control of such minor;
- (2) Who is on any lawful business, emergency or otherwise, or engaged in any lawful occupation;
- (3) Who is travelling under orders issued to him from any of the Armed Forces of the United States.

Section 2. Curfew Extension.

The Sheriff of Washoe County may extend the curfew hour to 1:00 A.M. on special occasions upon the written request of any school or church official, or state or county official. Such extensions shall be granted by the Sheriff for a particular date specified in writing by the Sheriff and filed with the County Clerk.

Section 3. Unlawful to Permit Loitering.

It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or other adult person having legal care, custody and control of any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years to permit or allow such minor to engage in any of the unlawful activity set forth in Section 1 (A) of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Penalties.

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of the ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment in the County Jail for not less than Thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months or by both fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. Repeal.

Ordinance No. 56 of Washoe County is hereby repealed. All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

Section 6. Validity.

If any provision or part of this Ordinance shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or unconstitutional, it shall in no way affect the remainder of this Ordinance or any section thereof, it being intended that the remainder shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as prescribed by NRS §244.100.
