ORDINANCE NO. 207

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING CONGESTED AREAS WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF WASHOE COUNTY FOR PURPOSES OF DOG CONTROL; PROHIBITING DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN CONGESTED AREAS; PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOUNDING OF DOGS FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR QUARANTINE OF BITING ANIMALS; PROVIDING REGULATIONS OF IMPOUNDING, DESTRUCTION AND RELEASE OF IMPOUNDED DOGS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS HEREOF; REPEALING WASHOE COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 153; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Definitions.

Certain words and terms used in this ordinance are defined for the purpose of this Ordinance as follows:

- A. Animal Control Officer: The term "Animal Control Officer" means the person appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County for the purpose of enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance.
- B. At Large: The term "At Large" means any place off the premises of the owner or person having custody and control of a dog and not accompanied by and under the control of the owner or any other person by physical restraint, or voice or signal command.
- C. Congested Area: The term "Congested Area" means those portions of the unincorporated area of Washoe County so designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County by description in Section 9 of this Ordinance. Map or maps designating said congested areas shall be on file and open to public inspection in the Offices of the Regional Planning Commission and the Washoe County Clerk.
- D. County: The term "County" means the unincorporated area of Washoe County and does not include those areas comprising incorporated cities.
- E. Health Officer: The term "Health Officer" means the Washoe County District Health Officer and his authorized representatives.
- F. Owner: The term "Owner" means any person owning, keeping or harboring a dog.

- G. Pound: The term "Pound" means any facility designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County for receiving and holding animals.

SECTION 2. Authority of Animal Control Officer and Health Officer.

- A. The Animal Control Officer is hereby empowered to enforce all provisions of this Ordinance and all laws of the State of Nevada relating to the care, treatment and impounding of animals. The Animal Control Officer is further empowered to take up, impound and safely keep any dog found to be in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance.
- B. The Health Officer is hereby empowered to enter upon any private property for the purpose of ascertaining whether any dog or other animal kept or harbored is infected with rabies. If it shall appear to the Health Officer or the Animal Control Officer that a dog or other animal may have rabies, he shall forthwith impound for observation such animal at the owner's expense, until examined by a veterinarian and released.

SECTION 3. Prohibits Dogs from Trespassing or Running at Large. It shall be unlawful for any owner or person having custody, control or possession of any dog to permit the same to trespass on any private property owned by another, or to run at large on any public highway, street, alley, court, park, school or playground in congested areas in the County. It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Officer, his authorized representatives, and every peace officer while on duty to take up and deliver to the Pound, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, all dogs found trespassing on private property or running at large within congested areas of the County.

SECTION 4. Impounding of Biting Dogs.

- A. When any animal bites a human within the County, the owner of such dog shall immediately place the dog in quarantine, or the Animal Control Officer or any peace officer may seize such dog, whether on or off the owner's premises, and place the dog in quarantine for such period of time as may be ordered by the District Health Officer. The animal to be quarantined shall be placed in confinement with a licensed veterinarian in a veterinary hospital or other place of quarantine approved by the District Health Officer, and such quarantine shall be at the owner's expense.
- B. Any dog quarantined shall remain in quarantine for such period of time as the District Health Officer shall order, and such dog shall not be released until a written release is issued by the District Health Officer.
- C. The owner of any animal placed in quarantine shall present to the District Health Officer a written statement executed by a veterinarian licensed to practice in the State of Nevada that the animal is free from diseases communicable to humans and that said animal has received inoculation for rabies.

SECTION 5. Promulgation of Regulations.

The poundkeeper, as designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County, is empowered to set forth reasonable regulations for charging owners or persons having the care, custody or possession of dogs impounded under this Ordinance, for all costs and maintenance incurred by said poundkeeper. In addition, said poundkeeper

is authorized to make such reasonable regulations for the destruction of impounded animals who are unfit for further keeping due to dangerous propensities, disease, age, or injury, and for the sale of impounded animals. No such regulations, however, shall be in force and effect until submitted to and approved by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County.

SECTION 6. Reclaiming Impounded Dogs.

The owner or person entitled to the custody or possession of any impounded dog may, at any time before the sale or other disposition thereof, reclaim or redeem such dog by paying to the poundkeeper all charges imposed for the impounding of the dog.

SECTION 7. Notice of Impoundment; Disposition of Unclaimed Dogs.

Where the identity of the owner of an impounded dog is discovered, such owner shall be given either oral or written notice of the impoundment. Forty-Eight (48) hours after oral notice is given, or Five (5) days after written notice is mailed, the impounded dog may be destroyed in a humane manner under the direction of the poundkeeper, provided, however, any such unredeemed dog authorized for destruction may be sold or given to any person in accordance with the regulations promulgated hereunder. In the event the identity of the owner of an impounded dog cannot be ascertained and notice given, then such dog may be disposed of pursuant to this Section Five (5) days after impoundment.

SECTION 8. Resisting or Obstructing the Animal Control Officer or Personnel, Unlawful.

No person shall interfere with or oppose or resist the Animal Control Officer or the Health Officer engaged in the performance of their duties pertaining to the enforcement of this Ordinance. All such officers, members and employees are hereby empowered to enforce all of the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. Determination of Congested Area.

The following described areas within the unincorporated area of Washoe County are hereby determined to be congested areas for the purpose of this Ordinance:

A. Border Town-Cold Springs

Beginning at the Section corner common to Sections 21, 22, 27 and 28, T. 21 N., R. 18 E. M.D.B. & M.; thence North to the quarter corner between Sections 15 and 16, T. 21 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B. & M.; thence West to the quarter corner between Sections 16 and 17, T. 21 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B. & M.; thence South to the section corner common to Sections 16, 17, 20 and 21, T. 21 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B. & M.; thence West to the section corner common to Sections 17, 18, 19 and 20, T. 21 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B. & M.; thence South to the section corner common to Sections 29, 30, 31 and 32, T. 21 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B. & M.; thence east to the westerly line of U. All of Sections 24 and 25, and the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Sections 23 and 26, all in T. 21 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B. & M.

C. North Lemmon Valley

All of Sections 15, 22, 23 and 26, and the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 21, all in T. 21 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M.

- D. South Lemmon Valley
All of Section 34, T. 21 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M. The $W\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 3, and all of Section 4, T. 20 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M.
- E. Anderson Acres
All that portion of Section 1, T. 20 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B. & M., lying southerly of U.S. Highway 395.
- F. Golden Valley
The $E\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 10 and all of Section 11, T. 20 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M.
- G. Verdi

Beginning at the section corner common to Sections 22, 23, 26 and 27, T. 19 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M.; thence South to the west quarter corner of the said Section 26; thence East, along the east-west center section line of the said Section 26, to the intersection with the Reno City Limit Line; thence along the Reno City Limit Line to the section corner common to Sections 23, 24, 25 and 26, T. 19 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M.; thence West to the section corner common to Sections 22, 23, 26 and 27 T. 19 N., R. 19 E., M.D.B. & M. the point of ending.

M. Truckee Meadows South of Reno

SECTION 10. Penalties.
Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

SECTION 11.
Washoe County Ordinance No. 153 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 12.
If any provision or part of this Ordinance shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or unconstitutional, it shall in no way affect the remainder of this Ordinance or any Section thereof, and the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 13.
This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as prescribed by NRS 244.100.


