SUMMARY: Provides for the licensing and inoculation of dogs against rabies in designated congested areas in the unincorporated area of Washoe County and establishes controls on animals in Washoe County.

ORDINANCE NO. 226

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND INOCULATION AGAINST RABIES OF DOGS IN DESIGNATED CONGESTED AREAS OF THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF WASHOE COUNTY; PROVIDES FOR SPECIAL PERMITS TO MAINTAIN IN EXCESS OF THREE DOGS; PROHIBITS DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE OR TRESPASSING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY; PROVIDES FOR THE QUARANTINE OF BITING ANIMALS; PROVIDES FOR THE DESIGNATION OF A POUNDKEEPER AND THE IMPOUNDMENT OF ANIMALS FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS FOR IMPOUNDMENT, DESTRUCTION AND RELEASE OF ANIMALS; PROHIBITS THE KEEPING OF NOISY ANIMALS; PROVIDES PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS HEREOF; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Definitions.

Certain words and terms used in this Ordinance are defined for the purpose of this Ordinance as follows:

- A. Animal Control Officer: The term "Animal Control Officer" means the person appointed by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County for the purpose of enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance, together with his deputies and authorized representatives.
- B. At Large: The term "At Large" means any place off the premises of the owner or person having custody and control of a dog and not accompanied by and under the control of the owner or any other responsible person by physical restraint, or voice or signal command.
- C. Congested Area: The term "Congested Area" means those portions of the unincorporated area of Washoe County so designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County by description in Section 21 of this Ordinance. Map or maps designating said congested areas shall be on file and open to public inspection in the Offices of the Regional Planning Commission and the Washoe County Clerk.
- D. County: The term "County" means the unincorporated area of Washoe County and does not include those areas comprising incorporated cities.
- E. <u>Health Officer</u>: The term "Health Officer" means the Washoe County District Health Officer and his authorized representatives.
- Noncommercial Kennel: The term "Noncommercial Kennel" means any enclosure, premises, building, structure, lot or area where more than three (3) dogs over six (6) months of age are kept, harbored or maintained (1) as pets, (2) for showing in recognized dog shows, field or obedience trials, (3) for working or hunting, or (4) for improving the variety or breed in temperament or conformation with a view to exhibition in shows or trials or for use as working dogs in hunting.

- G. Owner: The term "Owner" means any person owning, keeping or harboring an animal.
- H. Pound: The term "Pound" means any facility designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County for receiving and holding animals.

SECTION 2. Authority of Animal Control Officer.

The Animal Control Officer is hereby empowered to enforce all provisions of this Ordinance and all laws of the State of Nevada relating to the care, treatment and impounding of animals. The Animal Control Officer is further empowered to take up, impound and safely keep any animal found to be in violation of the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. Collections and Disbursements.

All moneys collected hereunder, unless otherwise provided by the County Commissioners, shall be paid into the General Fund of the County.

SECTION 4. Resisting or Obstructing the Animal Control Officer or Health Officer, Unlawful.

No person shall interfere with or resist the Animal Control Officer or Health Officer while engaged in the performance of their duties pertaining to the enforcement of this Ordinance. All such officers and employees are hereby empowered to enforce all of the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. Licenses, Permits, Vaccinations and Fees.

- A. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person owning, harboring or having the care, custody or possession of any dog to keep or maintain any such dog in any place in a congested area in the County unless such dog is licensed as hereinafter provided.
- B. The licensing functions and duties shall be performed by the Animal Control Officer, his deputy or authorized representatives.
- Every person owning or having the care, custody or possession of a dog or dogs in the County shall pay to the Animal Control Officer an annual license fee of \$2.00. Such license shall be for the license year, or any part thereof, during which any such dog is so owned, kept or maintained, and shall be payable in advance. The license fee shall be due and payable on or before the 1st day of July of each year. Any person so owning, keeping or maintaining a dog within a congested area of the County who has not obtained a current license on or before July 31st of each year shall be declared delinquent, shall be required to obtain a current license and in addition to the regular license fee herein provided, shall pay a penalty of \$5.00 to the Animal Control Officer. Upon exhibition of the proper certificate of vaccination pursuant to the provisions of Subsection D of this Section, and the payment of the proper license fee, the Animal Control Officer shall issue a certificate stating the license year for which such license fee is paid, the date of payment, the name and residence address of the person to whom such license is issued, and a description of the dog, and shall issue a metal or plastic tag number to correspond with the license or certificate of registry with the license year stamped thereon.

- D. The Animal Control Officer, his deputy or authorized representative shall not issue a license for any dog until:
  - (1) Such dog has been vaccinated with canine rabies vaccine by a doctor qualified to practice veterinary medicine in the State in which the dog was vaccinated, and the owner or person in possession of the dog shall produce a certificate of vaccination, the expiration date of which shall not occur prior to December 31st of the license year for which the license is issued. Each such certificate of vaccination shall expire as noted on the vaccination certificate and shall set forth the name and address of the owner of such dog, sufficient information to identify the dog vaccinated, the date of the vaccination, and the type and lot of the vaccine used; or
  - (2) The owner or person in possession of said dog shall furnish a statement from a qualified doctor of veterinary medicine confirming that said dog should be exempt from vaccination.
- E. It shall be the duty of the owner of the dog or person having control or possession of the dog for which a license has been paid and a tag issued to attach such tag to a suitable collar around the dog's neck, and if such tag shall be lost, to procure a new license and to pay the fee of \$1.00 therefor. Licensed dogs confined on the premises of the owner shall not be required to wear a license tag and collar while so confined. However, the owner shall produce evidence of current licensing upon request of the Animal Control Officer or Health Officer.

SECTION 6. Licensing Exemptions.
The licensing provisions of Section 5 of this Ordinance shall not apply to:

- A. Dogs under six (6) months of age, provided they are kept within an enclosure and are not allowed to run at large; or
- B. Dogs which are being trained pursuant to authorization from Guide Dogs for the Blind, or are actually being used to act as a guide for the blind, provided such dogs are not allowed to run at large; or
- C. Dogs under the care and in the possession of a licensed veterinarian; or
- D. Dogs owned or maintained by a noncommercial kennel operator pursuant to a special permit issued by the Animal Control Officer. Provided, however, that the owner or person in possession of such dog shall produce a certificate of vaccination for such dog upon request of the Animal Control Officer or any peace officer while on duty.

SECTION 7. Unauthorized Removal of License Tag.

It shall be unlawful for any person to remove any license tag issued under the provisions of this Ordinance from any dog not owned by him or not lawfully in his possession or under his control, or for any person to place on any dog, or to permit any dog in his control or possession to wear any license tag not issued as provided in this Ordinance for that particular dog for the then current license year.

## SECTION 8. Permit to Keep More Than Three (3) Dogs.

- A. Except as herein provided, no person shall keep more than three (3) dogs over six (6) months of age at any place, or on any premises, or in any residence located within a congested area in the unincorporated area of Washoe County, within 200 feet of any other dwelling house, used or occupied by human beings other than the owner of such dogs, without first obtaining a special permit from the County therefor, as hereinafter provided.
- B. For a period of one (1) year following the effective date of this Ordinance, the owners of more than three (3) dogs shall have the option of obtaining a special permit or individually licensing their dogs.

## SECTION 9. Permit Procedure.

- A. Application for a special permit to keep and maintain more than three (3) dogs over the age of six (6) months shall be made to the Animal Control Officer. The application shall specify the number of dogs for which a special permit is requested. Upon receipt of the application, the Animal Control Officer shall investigate the premises for which the application is made and shall approve the application and issue a special permit if he finds all of the following:
  - (1) Keeping the dogs at the location specified in the application will not violate any Ordinance, rule or regulation of Washoe County or the District Health Officer or any law of the State of Nevada; and
  - (2) The premises contain an adequate enclosure for keeping the dogs; and
  - (3) Maintenance of the dogs will not endanger the peace, health, or safety of persons residing in Washoe County; and
  - (4) The premises are capable of being maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, and any dog therein will not be subject to neglect, cruelty or abuse; and
  - (5) Keeping and maintenance of the dogs will not constitute a nuisance as defined in NRS 40.140.
- B. Within ten (10) days following the inspection of the premises, the Animal Control Officer shall approve, conditionally approve, or disapprove the application for the special permit. If the application is conditionally approved, the Animal Control Officer shall specify in writing those conditions upon which the special permit will be issued.
- C. If the applicant is dissatisfied with any decision of the Animal Control Officer he may, within fifteen (15) days after such decision, appeal from the decision of the Animal Control Officer to the Board of County Commissioners. The Board of County Commissioners shall consider such evidence as is presented relating to the decision of the Animal Control Officer and may reverse, approve, or modify the decision of the Animal Control Officer by a simple majority vote.

D. Failure of the Animal Control Officer to render a decision within ninety (90) days from the date of application shall constitute approval of the application for a special permit.

SECTION 10. Special Permit Fee.

A person owning or operating a noncommercial kennel pursuant to a special permit need not license each dog individually, but shall pay a permit fee for such kennel in accordance with the following fee schedule:

- A. To and including ten (10) dogs, \$15.00.
- B. More than ten (10) dogs, \$25.00.

The fee for a special permit shall be waived in the case of dogs who are being trained as guides for the blind pursuant to authorization from Guide Dogs for the Blind.

SECTION 11. Revocation of Special Permit.

After reasonable notice of noncompliance, a special permit issued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance may be suspended or revoked by the Animal Control Officer for any cause which would justify the disapproval or conditional approval of an application for a special permit pursuant to the provisions of Section 9A of this Ordinance.

Any person whose special permit is suspended or revoked by the Animal Control Officer shall have the right of appeal to the Board of County Commissioners as set forth in Section 9C of this Ordinance. Proceedings for suspension or revocation shall not be commenced on the basis of complaints not verified by the Animal Control Officer, his deputies or authorized representatives.

SECTION 12. Premises Inspections.

Every person, firm or corporation required to obtain a special permit under the provisions of this Ordinance must permit their premises to be inspected, upon request, by the Animal Control Officer or the Health Officer at any reasonable time.

SECTION 13. Prohibits Dogs from Trespassing or Running at Large. It shall be unlawful for any owner or person having custody, control or possession of any dog to permit the same to trespass on any private property owned by another, or to run at large on any public highway, street, alley, court, park, school, playground, or private street open for use to the general public in congested areas in the County. The Animal Control Officer, his authorized representatives, and every peace officer while on duty, are hereby authorized to take up and impound, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, all dogs found trespassing on private property or running at large within congested areas of the County.

SECTION 14. Impounding of Biting Animals.

- A. When any animal bites a human within the County, the owner of such animal shall immediately place the animal in quarantine, or the Animal Control Officer or any peace officer may seize such animal, whether on or off the owner's premises, and place the animal in quarantine for such period of time as may be ordered by the District Health Officer. The animal to be quarantined shall be placed in confinement with a licensed veterinarian in a veterinary hospital or other place of quarantine approved by the District Health Officer, and such quarantine shall be at the owner's expense.
- B. Any animal quarantined shall remain in quarantine for such period of time as the District Health Officer shall order, and such animal shall not be released until a written release is issued by the District Health Officer.

C. The owner of any animal placed in quarantine shall present to the District Health Officer a written statement executed by a veterinarian licensed to practice in the State of Nevada that the animal has received inoculation for rabies.

SECTION 15. Promulgation of Regulations.

The Poundkeeper, as designated by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County, is empowered to set forth reasonable regulations for charging owners or persons having the care, custody or possession of animals impounded under this Ordinance, for all costs and maintenance incurred by said Poundkeeper. In addition, said Poundkeeper is authorized to make such reasonable regulations for the destruction of impounded animals who are unfit for further keeping due to dangerous propensities, disease, age, or injury, and for the sale of impounded animals. No such regulations, however, shall be in force and effect until submitted to and approved by the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County.

SECTION 16. Reclaiming Impounded Animals.

The owner or person entitled to the custody or possession of any impounded animal may, at any time before the sale or other disposition thereof, reclaim or redeem such animal by paying to the Poundkeeper all charges imposed for the impounding of the animal.

SECTION 17. Notice of Impoundment; Disposition of Unclaimed Animals. Where the identity of the owner of an impounded animal is discovered, such owner shall be given notice of the impoundment by certified mail, return receipt requested. Seventy-two (72) hours after a postal return receipt shows a written notice of impoundment was delivered, or seven (7) days after written notice is mailed, the impounded animal may be destroyed in a humane manner under the direction of the Pound-keeper, provided, however, any such unredeemed animal authorized for destruction may be sold or given to any person in accordance with the regulations promulgated hereunder. In the event the identity of the owner of an impounded animal cannot be ascertained and notice given, then such animal may be disposed of pursuant to this Section five (5) days after impoundment.

SECTION 18. Animals - Noises.

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, harbor, or own any dog, animal or poultry which by loud and frequent barking, yelping, braying or other noise constitutes a nuisance as defined in NRS 40.140.

SECTION 19. Entry of Private Property by Animal Control Officer.

The Washoe County Animal Control Officer is hereby authorized and directed to take up and impound any animal kept or found on private property if such animal has been observed by said Animal Control Officer to be in violation of Section 13 of this Ordinance, or if such animal is being subjected to torture or cruelty as defined in NRS 574.050.

The Officer should exercise caution when utilizing this right of entry. Force must not be used to enter private property which may cause damage or destruction to property or bodily harm. If the owner, by some act, bars the Officer's way onto the premises, the Officer should retire from the scene. The Animal Control Officer shall leave written notice of impoundment on the premises from which the animal is taken.

SECTION 20. Animal Control Devices.

In the performance of his duties, the Animal Control Officer and his authorized representatives shall have the authority to use all animal control devices commonly used by other animal control agencies located within the State of Nevada. The Animal Control Officer or his authorized representative will consult with the Western Nevada Veterinary Society (WNVS) or its representatives concerning the type and method of use of tranquilizer drugs.

SECTION 21. Determination of Congested Area.
The following described areas within the unincorporated area of Washoe
County are hereby determined to be congested areas for the purpose of
this Ordinance:

SECTION 22. Police Dogs.

Dogs used by a public law-enforcement agency shall be exempt from the licensing and special permit provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 23. Penalties.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

SECTION 24. Repeal.
Washoe County Ordinance No. 207 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 25. Savings Clause.

If any provision or part of this Ordinance shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal or unconstitutional, it shall in no way affect the remainder of this Ordinance or any section thereof, and the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 26. Effective Date of Licensing Provisions.

The provisions of this Ordinance which require licensing of dogs shall be in full force and effect on and after the lst day of July 1974.

SECTION 27.
This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as prescribed by NRS 244.100.
