NOTICE OF COUNTY ORDINANCE
Notice is hereby given that Bill No. 452, Ordinance No. 287, amending Ordinance No. 226 entitled "An Ordinance amending an Ordinance providing for the licensing and inoculation against rabies of dogs in designated congested areas of the unincorporated area of Washoe County; provides for special permits to maintain in excess of three dogs; prohibits dogs running at large or trespassing on private property; provides for the quarantine of biting animals; provides for the designation of a Poundkeeper and the impoundment of animals found in violation of the provisions of this ordinance; providing for regulations for impoundment, destruction and release of animals; prohibits the keeping of noisy animals; provides penalties for noncompliance with the provisions herof; and other matters properly relating thereto," was adopted on September 25, 1975 by Commissioners Scott, Grow, Rusk, Nelson and Gaunt all voting aye.

SUMMARY: Amends Washoe County Ordinance No. 226 to provide that all fees and permits required under the provisions of Washoe County Ordinance No. 226 are annual fees and permits, and empowers the animal control officer, his representatives, and peace officers to impound all dogs in the County which are endangering private or public property, public safety, themselves, or other animals.

ORDINANCE NO. 287

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND INOCULATION AGAINST RABIES OF DOGS IN DESIGNATED CONGESTED AREAS OF THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF WASHOE COUNTY; PROVIDES FOR SPECIAL PERMITS TO MAINTAIN IN EXCESS OF THREE DOGS; PROHIBITS DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE OR TRESPASSING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY; PROVIDES FOR THE QUARANTINE OF BITING ANIMALS; PROVIDES FOR THE DESIGNATION OF A POUNDKEEPER AND THE IMPOUNDMENT OF ANIMALS FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS FOR IMPOUNDMENT, DESTRUCTION AND RELEASE OF ANIMALS; PROHIBITS THE KEEPING OF NOISY ANIMALS; PROVIDES PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS HEREOF; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1.

The title to Washoe County Ordinance No. 226 is hereby amended to read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND INOCULATION AGAINST RABIES OF DOGS IN DESIGNATED CONGESTED AREAS OF THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF WASHOE COUNTY; PROVIDES FOR SPECIAL PERMITS TO MAINTAIN IN EXCESS OF THREE DOGS; PROHIBITS DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE OR TRESPASSING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY; PROVIDES FOR THE QUARANTINE OF BITING ANIMALS; PROVIDES FOR THE DESIGNATION OF A POUNDKEEPER AND THE IMPOUNDMENT OF ANIMALS FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS FOR IMPOUNDMENT, DESTRUCTION AND RELEASE OF ANIMALS; PROHIBITS THE KEEPING OF NOISY ANIMALS; PROVIDES FOR THE IMPOUNDING OF ALL DOGS ENDANGERING PRIVATE OR PUBLIC PROPERTY, PUBLIC SAFETY, THEMSELVES, OR OTHER ANIMALS; PROVIDES PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS HEREOF; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

SECTION 2.

Section 3 of Washoe County Ordinance No. 226 is hereby amended by the addition of the following sentence: All fees and permits required under the provisions of this ordinance are annual fees.

SECTION 3.

The title of Section 13 of Washoe County Ordinance No. 226 is hereby amended to read "Prohibits dogs from trespassing or running at large and provides for the impounding of dogs endangering property or public safety and dogs, other animals and fowl doing damage to or trespassing upon private property." Section 13 of Washoe County Ordinance No. 226 is further amended by the addition of the following sentences to said section: The animal control officer, his authorized representatives, and every peace officer while on duty, are hereby authorized to take up and impound all dogs in the County which are endangering private or public property, public safety, themselves, or other animals. Any dog, other animal, or fowl found doing damage to or trespassing upon private property in the County may be taken up by the owner of such property or his representative, at his own risk, and delivered forthwith to the animal control center, or held until the animal control officer, his deputies, or authorized representatives can take the dog, other animal, or fowl into custody for impound.

SECTION 4.

Section 23 of Washoe County Ordinance No. 226 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 23. Penalties.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). For failure to appear in the proper court to answer to such misdemeanor citation, such person failing to appear shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). For any second conviction for violation of the same provision of this Ordinance, such person violating that provision shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

SECTION 5.

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Washoe finds that an emergency exists and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
