ORDINANCE NO. 532

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A MERIT AWARD PROGRAM FOR WASHOE COUNTY EMPLOYEES; CREATING A MERIT AWARD BOARD; PROVIDING PROCEDURES FOR ACCEPTANCE OF COUNTY EMPLOYEE SUGGESTIONS FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES AND FOR PRESENTATION OF CERTIFICATES OR CASH AWARDS FOR ADOPTED SUGGESTIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF MONEYS; AND PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO" BY MAKING TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Section 3 of Ordinance No. 218 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 3.

- A. The controlling authority of the Merit Award Program shall be known as the Merit Award Board.
- B. The Board shall be composed of five members as follows:
  - 1. Two representatives of employee associations now or hereafter established, with not more than one representative from each association appointed by the associations in accordance with their bylaws and operating practices, and by mutual agreement among themselves. In the same manner, an alternate representative or representatives may be appointed to sit and participate in the place and stead of any regular member appointed by an employee association at any meeting where said regular member is unable to attend.
  - 2. The Internal Auditor.
  - 3. The Personnel Administrator.
  - 4. One member appointed by and representing the Board of County Commissioners.
- C. The Internal Auditor shall serve as the secretary of the board.

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- D. The board shall make rules and regulations for transacting its business and carrying out the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 2.

Section 7 of Washoe County Ordinance No. 218 is hereby amended to read as follows:


SECTION 7.

- A. Insofar as it may be equitable and practicable, the amount of the cash award allowed for an employee's suggestion shall be predicated upon the savings to the county. No cash award may exceed \$100.
- B. Cash payments to employees arising out of adopted suggestions shall be paid from moneys appropriated by the Board of County Commissioners for such purpose.
- C. No more than \$1,000 each fiscal year may be expended on merit award plans.
