SUMMARY: Amends Washoe County Code by establishing durational period for vaccination against rabies and by requiring signature of veterinarian to be placed on certificate of rabies vaccination.

ORDINANCE NO. 805

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WASHOE COUNTY CODE BY ESTABLISHING A DURATIONAL PERIOD FOR VACCINATION AGAINST RABIES; REQUIRING THE SIGNATURE OF A VETERINARIAN ON A CERTIFICATE OF RABIES VACCINATION; AND PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Section 55.320 of the Washoe County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

55.320 Rabies vaccination of dogs required; revaccinations.

1. Every dog 4 months of age and older shall be vaccinated against rabies. Young dogs shall be vaccinated within 30 days after they have reached 4 months of age. Unvaccinated dogs acquired or moved into the county must be vaccinated within 30 days after purchase or arrival, unless under 4 months of age, as specified in this subsection.

2. The vaccination required by subsection 1 of this section remains valid for 2 years and revaccinations must occur at not later than 2 year intervals thereafter.

SECTION 2. Section 55.322 of the Washoe County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

55.322 Duties of veterinarian when vaccinating dog; vaccination tags for dogs.

1. Each veterinarian, at the time of vaccinating or revaccinating any dog, shall complete a certificate of rabies vaccination in duplicate which shall include the following information:


- (a) Owner's name and address.
- (b) Description of dog (breed, sex, markings, age, name).
- (c) Date of vaccination.
- (d) Rabies vaccination tag number.
- (e) Type of rabies vaccine administered.
- (f) Manufacturer's serial number of vaccine.

2. The veterinarian shall sign the completed certificate of rabies vaccination, provide the certificate to the owner of the animal vaccinated and retain a copy thereof. The veterinarian and the owner shall retain their copies for the 2-year interval between vaccinations specified in section 55.320. A metal or durable plastic tag, serially numbered, issued by the veterinarian who has vaccinated the dog, shall be securely attached to the collar of the dog. Whenever the dog is outdoors, whether on or off the owner's premises, the collar with the vaccination tag must be worn.
